

December 2024 Reflection

Rerun: First Sunday of Advent, Hope and Apocalypse

"So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come." (Mark 13:29, 32-33, NRSV)

Advent means "arrival" or "the coming of Christ into the world." While we emphasize the first arrival of Christ, it is the second arrival that is the nucleus of Christian hope.

Karl Barth emphasizes advent as a time when we remember our locale in the in-between; we are in both the "already here" and the "not yet" of the Kingdom of God. Christ already enables us to live into a new being all while knowing things won't be fully redeemed until they are.

In this in-between, we are promised many things to happen, and none can tell us when "the end" will arrive.

This is just what apocalyptic literature does. It describes present, rather than future, trials. The author of Mark's gospel has likely already experienced the first century uprising and the destruction of the temple, just as the prophets of the Hebrew Scriptures are already many times already amid war, chaos, and exile. They explain the present through a theological lens. Things don't "get" scary, they *are already* scary.

These stories are contained in our Bible for comfort rather than terror. Stories of the Exodus, the Babylonian exile, the persecution of Jews in first-century Rome, the subsequent uprising and destruction of the temple, and all our shared history between then and now are frightening. They also testify to our hope. As apocalyptic as many events were, God's people, the temple, and the church have all persisted.

The "end" hasn't yet been the end, and so what if it is?

Worlds have ended for individuals and for entire groups of people. This is the "in-between" life that Jesus promised. All the bad that has happened, is happening, and will happen may steer us toward despair and violence if we let it.

We cannot control what the world does to us. We can control how we respond. Will the world dictate our actions, or will we witness to the second advent, the coming kingdom marked by love and grace?

It is to this we are called.






Adult Sunday School – Dennis Harmon 9:45 a.m. – 10:30 a.m.

WE HOPE TO GIVE A LOCAL FAMILY A MERRY CHRISTMAS!


